



Education Reach for Texans 10th Annual Conference Call for Presenters/Proposals

When & where is the conference:

The 10th Annual Education Reach for Texans Conference is hosted by the Texas Institute of Child and Family Wellbeing and The University of Texas at Austin. The conference dates are **Friday and Saturday June 6-7, 2019** and the event will be held at the **Renaissance Austin Marriot Hotel** (9721 Arboretum Blvd, Austin TX 78759)

For the past nine years nearly 200 child welfare practitioners, researchers, foster care liaisons and advocates join us for the annual conference. Every 2-year and 4-year institution/college/university in Texas is required to have a liaison for foster care alumni, we want to successfully prepare liaisons for their roles in supporting students on their campuses and challenge existing programs to grow and do more. The conference will offer opportunities to build partnerships, grow your networks, enhance your programs, gain support, and establish strong accountability systems.

Presenter selection & registration:

Reach will review presenter applications on a rolling basis until March 22, 2019. We will not consider incomplete applications. We plan to make all selections and notify presenters by the end of March 2019. Presenters selected will be entitled to a conference registration discount but will be required to register for the conference.

What kind of proposals are you looking for?

We are looking for proposals that demonstrate meaningful, effective, and sustainable collaborations across research, policy, and practice to increase learning opportunities for all. There will be opportunities for child welfare providers and foster care liaisons to build skills and learn best practices, as well as opportunities for young people use their voice and to grow their leadership abilities. Depending on the proposals we receive there could be workshops for professionals in the field and workshops aimed at a mixed audience of youth and professionals.
